The Rock School IB Admissions Policy

All students admitted to The Rock School in grades K-5 are simultaneously admitted to the Primary Years Program. In the same manner, all students admitted to The Rock School in grades 6-10 are simultaneously admitted to the Middle Years Program. Likewise, all students admitted to The Rock School in grades 11-12 are simultaneously admitted into the Diploma Program.

The process of being admitted to The Rock School as seen in the TRS Admissions Policy, is independent of admission to the PYP, MYP and DP programs.

Policy Review Process

The Admissions Policy will be reviewed and revised every other year by a team of school administration, IB coordinators, and teachers. All proposed changes will be brought before the PLT (Pedagogical Leadership Team) for approval.

The Rock School seeks students with a solid academic record who will benefit from educational excellence in a Christ-centered community. Admittance is based on past academic and social performance, as shown through grade history, standardized test scores, teachers' recommendations, and an educational consultation. The purpose of our admissions process has always been to ensure applicants will flourish at The Rock School.

The Rock School admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. - Student Essay (grades 6-12 only), from prompt included in the Online Application

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

CRITERIA	DOCUMENTS
 The student must be at least 16 years old. The student must be entering grade 10 or 11. The student must have high English proficiency. The international student's guardian must have permanent or established residency in the United States. A visitor's visa does not meet this requirement. The Rock School does not provide boarding or host families. All living arrangements are the responsibility of the student's family.
